

# KS1 half term SUBJECT OVERVIEW— AUTUMN 1 2017

**Literacy**— will focus on stories with familiar settings and themes that are familiar to the children, for example home, school, making friends, getting lost and linking with PHSE and feelings. Children will consider the grammar rules for writing and sequencing stories and begin to use these in their own writing.

**Numeracy**— will focus on place value and addition and subtraction, including: counting to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning from any number; counting, reading and writing numbers to 100 numerals; counting in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s; identifying one more or one less from a given number; represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20; add and subtract 1 digit and 2

**PHSE** Children will be taught to recognise and respect differences, what is fair and unfair, choosing between right and wrong. They will think about their feelings and learn to deal with them in a positive way, considering how

**PE** Children will learn basic PE skills through playing games, using observation, peer



**Science** will develop children's understanding of how we change as we grow older in terms of how we look and what we are able to do. Working scientifically, children will group and classify, carry out comparative tests and observe changes over time, noticing differences and similarities. We will also look at how hygiene plays a part in

**Art/DT** We will observe ourselves and each other carefully, select and mix colours to produce self and family portraits. In addition, children will have the opportunity to use ICT (see below) and select craft materials to

## **History/Geography**

Children will learn about their own locality and will identify the UK and its countries on a map. They will look at landmarks and how they are represented on a map, learning basic skills for

**RE** Children will discuss the concept of belonging and family, learning about the values of the Christian Church and the importance of the Bible to Christians. They will listen to some of the parables in the Bible and will think about how these are

**MUSIC** is an integral part of our curriculum and will be included in most subjects. Children will be learning songs relating to topics studied, and learning and performing songs

**ICT** will be used to compliment teaching in most subjects in the curriculum throughout the year. Children will use computers to research

**FRENCH** will aim to develop children's confidence of listening, using and understanding language and French culture through the topic of myself and my body. Children will be working towards

**Reception children** will be taught alongside Y1/Y2 children but will focus on the Early Learning Goals which are interrelated and overlap and can take place in any area of the above curriculum areas.
