

KS1 FOUNDATION SUBJECTS OVERVIEW— AUTUMN 1st HALF-TERM 2016

Geography/History

Pupils will develop their knowledge about their immediate locality. They will learn basic subject-specific vocabulary relating to human and physical geography and begin to use mapping skills, including first-hand observation, to enhance their locational awareness.

Science

In this unit children will look at the changing seasons and discover ways of recording our weather, collecting data and measuring temperature, rainfall and wind speed. They will talk about their environment through the seasons, linking with the New Curriculum in using and exploring materials, discovering the many uses of trees/wood for animals and humans, as well as other materials, linking with DT/Art.

RE/PHSE

Children will find out about the Christian festival and traditions of Harvest through stories, songs and art, focussing on the importance of sharing and saying thank you. They will learn about making good choices to enable everyone to work cooperatively.

What's Outside?/Harvest time.



ICT - Children will have the opportunity to use computers and software to compliment their learning in all subjects throughout the year. They will develop keyboard/mouse skills, logic and reasoning and basic programming skills.

Art/DT

Pupils will learn about colour, in particular the warm colours associated with Autumn. They will look at the work of other artists, such as Monet, to see the colours used through the seasons. Linking with science they will begin to use tools to create a bird house from wood. Then, towards the end of the half term, DT will compliment learning in literacy, designing a hat for a magician or a witch.

PE "Games/Gymnastics" -

Children will learn basic PE skills such as throwing and catching and also explore basic gymnastic shapes and balances, through playing games and using observation, peer and self-assessment.

FRENCH

will aim to develop children's confidence of listening to language, using and understanding language through songs, rhymes and stories such as Little Red Riding Hood and the Little Red Hen. Children will be working towards the objectives set out in the KS2 language framework.

Reception children will be taught alongside Y1/Y2 children but will focus on the Early Learning Goals which are interrelated and overlap and can take place in any area of the above curriculum areas.
