

KS1 FOUNDATION SUBJECTS OVERVIEW— SPRING 2nd HALF-TERM 2018

Literacy "Up the Beanstalk" - will develop children's pleasure in reading through Traditional Tales, poetry and non-fiction books. They will write instructions, personal recounts and fictional stories to develop writing stamina and learn the key writing skills such as punctuation, using tense correctly and consistently, using co-ordination (and/or/but) and some subordination (when/if/that/because), using the correct spelling rules set out in the NC Appendix 1 and the grammatical rules in Appendix 2.

Maths - Y2 will begin by revising properties of shape, moving on to capacity and reading scales, recognising and writing fractions, particularly focussing on finding out a $\frac{1}{3}$ of something, telling the time to 5 minute intervals, solving addition or subtraction problems and continued practise of multiplication and division for 2, 5 and 10.
Y1 will revise shape and directions, patterns and sequences, number bonds and addition and subtraction

Science "Healthy plants and animals" - Children will identify non-living and living things in their environment and learn about the different parts of plants through practical experiments and observations, monitoring seed growth and looking at the consequences of not giving plants the habitats they need for healthy growth. They will consider different habitats in other parts of the world and how certain plants and animals have adapted to live there.

Geography- will link to science, looking at hot and cold parts of the world, continents and seas.
In **History** we will find out about how travel to other parts of the world has changed over the last 100 years and why the Wright brothers and Amy Johnson were famous.



DT/Art "Moving Pictures"
Children will think up exciting and inventive ways to bring pictures to life through a variety of moving mechanisms. They will explore sliders, levers, pivots and wheel mechanisms and how they can be used to make different parts of a picture move. Linking with science and history they will continue to develop their observational skills, drawing and painting what they see or imagine.

FRENCH will aim to develop children's confidence of listening, using and understanding language and French culture through the topics of Jack and the Beanstalk and Easter. Children will be working towards the objectives set out in the KS2 language framework.

PE "Ball Skills" -
Children will develop basic skills through observation, practical application and peer and self-assessment.

RE/PHSE— Easter
In this unit children will learn about events around the crucifixion of Jesus and will discuss sad/happy times in their own lives, linking with our PHSE topic of "feelings" and being self aware. They will also discuss the resurrection of Jesus linking to New Life and Growth in our science topic.

Reception children will be taught alongside Y1/Y2 children but will focus on the Early Learning Goals which are interrelated and overlap and can take place in any area of the above curriculum areas.
