

KS1 FOUNDATION SUBJECTS OVERVIEW— AUTUMN 2nd HALF-TERM 2020 JS

Maths Focus - Y1: Recognising and naming common 2D and 3D shapes, positional language, number patterns, time and comparing different quantities and measurements.
Y2: Exploring patterns of 2D and 3D shapes and the properties of shapes, symmetry, ordering and comparing numbers and quantities using < > and = symbols, telling the time to the nearest quarter, number facts to 100 and adding and subtracting using money.

English—“Light and Dark”.

Children will continue to explore poetry complimenting our learning about Guy Fawkes and Remembrance. We will listen to the story of the Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark and children will learn how descriptive writing can enhance their own story writing. Non fiction work will allow children to write facts about nocturnal animals and then Christmas stories will focus on using punctuation, letter writing, instructions and sequencing activities.

Science “Our Senses” -

Children will look at how the changing seasons can have an effect on animals at this time of the year. They will learn about the 5 senses and the parts of the body associated with each sense. They will research facts on some nocturnal animals, learning how some animals have super senses, thinking of ideas and answers to questions from their observations, and producing non-fiction reports on a nocturnal animal.

History- “Light and Dark” Children will find out about Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate Bonfire Night. They will learn some of the history behind Remembrance Day and consider why it is important to remember the past. They will find out about Florence Nightingale, comparing our lives today with lives in the past, and how our lives have changed because of things that happened in the past.



FRENCH

will aim to develop children's confidence in the language by listening to, using and understanding language through the topics of “Clothing and colours” and the story of Little Red Riding Hood. Children will be working towards the objectives set out in the KS2 language

ART/DT “Light and Dark” -

Pupils will learn how using different techniques and media and processes can create different effects through learning about the artist Vincent van Gogh and his work “Starry Night”. They will also use a variety of materials to make Christmas decorations and pictures.

PE “Gymnastics” -

Children will practise basic gymnastic movement to encourage core strengthening to enable them to perform controlled actions and balances.

PHSE - “Getting On and Falling Out”

Children will explore the qualities necessary to get along with each other, to recognise and deal with their feelings in a positive way in order to work and play cooperatively.

RE - “Light and the Christmas Story”-

Children will learn that light is a symbol in religion including Christianity. They will explore light in the Hindu festival of Divali and think reflectively about their own feelings and share their own experiences. Children will listen to the Christian story of the Nativity, and consider why Christians believe that Jesus is the Light of the World.

Reception children will be taught alongside Y1/Y2 children but will focus on the Early Learning Goals which are interrelated and overlap and can take place in any area of the above curriculum areas.
